CHAPTER ONE

GENERAL PROVISIONS

PURPOSE, SCOPE, DEFINITIONS, LEGAL BASIS AND EXECUTION

PURPOSE

ARTICLE 1 - The competition is organized with the aim of reducing waste production, ensuring the protection of natural resources, preventing food waste, encouraging recycling and upcycling practices, and developing environmental awareness and sustainability awareness among students. The competition aims to encourage students to produce innovative and creative projects on zero waste and sustainability, and to increase environmental awareness at an international level.

SCOPE

ARTICLE 2 - The ToR covers the competition categories, the application procedures and methods, evaluation criteria and award principles for students and schools studying in public and private schools in Türkiye in the 2025-2026 academic year, and for students and schools studying abroad in countries where Turkish education counselors, education attachés or Türkiye Maarif Foundation Schools are located.

DEFINITIONS

ARTICLE 3 -

MoNE: T.R. Ministry of National Education

DGSS: Directorate General of Support Services

School Evaluation Commission: It refers to the School Evaluation Committee consisting of at least three (3) members, including teachers and administrative staff, within the schools where competition applications will be made and artworks/products will be evaluated at the national level (in Türkiye).

District Evaluation Commission: It refers to the District Evaluation Commission, which is formed within the district national education directorates to evaluate the artworks/products participating in the competition at the national level (in Türkiye), and consists of at least 5 (five) people, including relevant branch teachers, field experts and representatives of relevant public institutions and organizations.

Provincial Evaluation Commission: It refers to the Provincial Evaluation Commission, which is formed within the provincial directorates of national education to evaluate the artworks/products participating in the competition at the national level (in Türkiye), and consists of at least 5 (five) people, including relevant branch teachers, field experts and representatives of relevant public institutions and organizations.

National Evaluation Commission: Refers to a National Evaluation Commission consisting of at least 5 (five) members, established within the MoNE to evaluate the artworks/products participating in the competition at the national level (Türkiye); it may consist of teachers from relevant branches, field experts, and representatives of relevant public institutions and organizations.

Regional Evaluation Commission: Refers to a Regional Evaluation Commission consisting of at least 5 (five) members, established within our MoNE to evaluate the artworks/products participating in the competition from the countries in the regions specified in Annex 3; consisting of MoNE personnel, field experts, and representatives of relevant public institutions and organizations.

International Evaluation Commission: Refers to the International Evaluation Commission established within the MoNE to evaluate artworks/products that have received awards at the regional and national levels; it consists of at least five (5) members, including MoNE staff,

field experts, academics, and representatives from relevant public institutions and organizations.

ARTICLE 5 -

The provisions of this competition rules are executed by the MoNE.

CHAPTER TWO
COMPETITION PROCEDURES AND PRINCIPLES
COMPETITION TYPES, COMPETITION CATEGORIES, PARTICIPANTS,
PARTICIPATION REQUIREMENTS, CONDITIONS FOR
ARTWORKS/PRODUCTS

COMPETITION TYPES

ARTICLE 6 - The competition includes students' artworks/products in the categories of upcycling-utility models, short films on food waste, and from waste to art, as well as schools' poster artworks/products on the theme of living school gardens.

COMPETITION CATEGORIES

ARTICLE 7 - The **Zero Waste and Sustainability Competition** will be held in the following categories.

7.1. Upcycling-Utility Model Category (*International High School Level*)

7.2. Food Waste Themed Short Film Category (*International Middle School and High School Levels*)

7.3. From Waste to Art Category (*National (Türkiye) Preschool, Primary School, Middle School, and High School Levels*)

7.4. Living School Gardens Category (*all international public schools and private schools*)

PARTICIPANTS

ARTICLE 8 - At the national level, students and public and private schools in Türkiye; and at the international level, students and schools studying in countries where there are educational counsellors/education attachés affiliated with the MoNE or Türkiye Maarif Foundation Schools (Annex-3) can participate in the competition.

PARTICIPATION REQUIREMENTS

ARTICLE 9 - The following conditions will be required for students and schools participating in the competition.

9.1. General Conditions

9.1.1. Participation in the competition is free of charge and based on voluntary participation.

9.1.2. Only one artwork/product may be submitted per category.

9.1.3. Participation in the competition will be provided through individual applications within the framework of the relevant authorities' control and approval.

9.1.4. Only one prize will be awarded for each winning artwork/product.

9.1.5. The competition languages are Turkish and English.

9.2. Application Process and Documents

9.2.1. Students and schools that will apply to the competition are expected to fully prepare the Competition Application Form in Annex-1 and the Consent Document in Annex-2. At the national level, school principals are responsible for approving the document in Annex 1 and registering and storing the document in Annex 2. At the international level, education advisors/education attachés affiliated with the MoNE's overseas organizations or, if available in the countries concerned, the school administrations of Türkiye Maarif Foundation Schools are responsible. These documents will be submitted to the MoNE upon request.

9.2.2. Students and schools participating in the competition from abroad must determine the region to which their country belongs from the table in Annex-3 and complete their applications by sending the approved version of the Competition Application Form in Annex-1 and the presentation file in PDF format to the e-mail address of their region via e-mail.

9.2.3. For national participation, students shall submit the approved Competition Application Form in Annex 1 and the presentation file in PDF format on a portable memory device to their school administration, and schools shall submit them to the district national education directorates.

9.3. Personal Data, Copyright and Publication Rights

9.3.1. The participant in the competition acknowledges that the responsibility for providing the necessary information, obtaining explicit consent, and processing and submitting to the MoNE any personal data, including the voice, image, or other personal information of third parties featured in the artwork/product submitted to the competition, in accordance with the Personal Data Protection Law No. 6698 and related legislation, lies solely with the author of the artwork/product. The MoNE is not responsible for any disputes that may arise regarding the consent of the persons appearing in the artworks/products or the rights of third parties.

9.3.2. By applying to the competition, the participant accepts that they transfer all rights to the artworks/products (reproduction, distribution, processing, modification, representation, sharing in digital or printed media, etc.) to the MoNE indefinitely, free of charge, and without geographical restrictions.

9.3.3. Artworks/Products submitted to the competition shall not be shared in any medium (social media, school events, etc.) prior to the awards ceremony.

9.4. Awards and Awards Ceremony Participation

9.4.1. Details of the winning artworks/products and the awards ceremony will be published on <https://dhgm.meb.gov.tr/>

9.4.2. The ownership and usage rights of awards won through individual participation belong to the relevant student/parent.

9.4.3. The Environmental Certificate won in the Living School Gardens category belongs to the school. Individuals cannot claim any rights over these awards.

9.4.4. Students and schools participating in the competition from abroad will attend the awards ceremony to be held in Türkiye, either by their own means or via video conference, if they receive an award or are entitled to present a poster.

9.5. General Provisions

9.5.1. Artworks/Products submitted to the MoNE will not be returned.

9.5.2. The evaluation commissions are not responsible for any damage or delays that may occur during the process until the electronic records of the artworks/products are delivered to the MoNE.

9.5.3. If any of the students or schools that have been awarded a prize are found to have violated the provisions of these rules, their prizes will be revoked and they will be required to return them. This situation will not affect other contestants in any way.

9.5.4. The competition results are final and cannot be appealed. Applications are archived for 1 (one) year.

9.5.5. Participants are deemed to have accepted all the conditions specified in these terms and conditions by submitting their application.

9.5.6. Turkish law shall apply to the resolution of any disputes arising from or in connection with this competition, and the courts and enforcement offices of Ankara shall have exclusive jurisdiction over the resolution of such disputes.

9.5.7. All materials used in the preparation of artworks/products within the scope of the competition must be environmentally friendly, free from chemicals harmful to human health, and not classified as hazardous waste.

CONDITIONS FOR ARTWORKS/PRODUCTS

ARTICLE 10 - The following conditions will be required for artworks participating in the competition.

10.1. General Requirements for Artworks/Products

10.1.1. Artworks/Products submitted to the competition must be original and must not have been entered into any other competition previously.

10.1.2. Each artwork/product must be given a name.

10.1.3. Artworks/products must not contain any advertising elements or logos representing any brand in any part of the artwork/product.

10.1.4. If any artworks/products contains quotations, the source must be indicated.

10.1.5. Damaged artworks/products that cannot be evaluated will not be accepted; artworks/products received by the commissions after the submission date will not be evaluated.

10.1.6. Care should be taken not to produce waste when creating the artworks/products.

10.2. Upcycling - Utility Model Category

10.2.1. Participants will design new and functional artworks/products from any type of old or unused waste material in this category.

10.2.2. Participants are free to use any technique and waste material (except hazardous waste) in their artworks/products.

10.2.3. A presentation file of up to 7 pages in PDF format will be prepared, including the purpose of the artwork/product, its environmental contribution, the materials used, the stages of production, the dimensions and technical specifications, and images taken from different angles.

10.2.4. Domestic (Türkiye) participants must submit the approved form in Annex 1, along with a presentation file in PDF format, to the school administration on a portable memory stick. International participants must submit the approved form in Annex 1, along with a presentation file in PDF format, to the email address designated for their region.

10.3. Food Waste Themed Short Film Category

10.3.1. The technique to be used in filming is left to the participant's preference.

10.3.2. The film will be submitted with a maximum duration of 5 (five) minutes.

10.3.3. The film must be prepared in MP4 or MOV format, in landscape orientation (1920×1080 pixels). Films with a resolution lower than 1080p will not be considered.

10.3.4. The copyrights of the images, text, sound, music, etc. used in the films must be purchased. The author of the artwork/product is responsible for any legal sanctions arising from the use of images, text, sound, music, etc. that are not original in the artwork/product.

10.3.5. Films must be in Turkish or English. If the film is prepared in English, Turkish subtitles must be added.

10.3.6. The participant's name, surname, or logo and information about the film must be included at the end of the film.

10.3.7. Participants from within the country (Türkiye) must submit their short film to the school administration on a portable storage device, along with the approved version of the form in Annex 1.

10.3.8. Those who will participate in the competition from abroad must send the link of the film they have uploaded to a download link (such as Google Drive or WeTransfer) that will be active for at least 7 (seven) days, to the e-mail address of their region by adding it to the Annex-1 form.

10.4. From Waste to Art Category

10.4.1. Only students at all levels studying in all public/private schools in Türkiye will be able to participate in the competition.

10.4.2. Participants will design artworks/products from waste materials in this category.

10.4.3. Participants are free to use any technique and any waste material (except hazardous waste) in their artworks/products.

10.4.4. A presentation file in PDF format, consisting of a maximum of 7 (seven) pages, will be prepared, including the purpose of the artwork/product, its environmental contribution, the materials used, the stages of production, the dimensions and technical specifications, and images taken from different angles.

10.4.5. Those who will participate in the competition must submit the approved form in Annex 1, a portable memory containing the presentation file, and the artwork/product to the school administration.

10.5. Living School Gardens Category

10.5.1. Schools will participate in the competition with posters summarizing their sustainable living practices (vertical gardens, green walls, composting areas, organic farming gardens, solar panels, renewable energy corners, recycling and upcycling, permaculture gardens, green roofs, etc.) with text and visuals.

10.5.2. Each school may participate in the competition with only one poster.

10.5.3. Posters shall be prepared in color, in A3 size, single-sided, and at a minimum resolution of 300 DPI.

10.5.4. The language of the poster must be Turkish or English.

10.5.5. If any quotations are used in the poster, the source must be indicated.

10.5.6. In addition to the poster they prepare, schools will prepare a presentation file in PDF format, consisting of a maximum of 7 pages, containing the purpose of the application, its environmental contribution, implementation stages, student and community participation, sustainability plan, and images taken from different angles of the artworks/products.

10.5.7. Schools that are eligible to exhibit their posters will bring their A3 size, high-quality prints and display them in the Poster Gallery during the awards ceremony at the specified time.

10.5.8. Participants in the competition must submit the approved form in Annex-1, the portable memory containing the poster and presentation file, and the artwork/product to the school commission.

10.5.9. Those who will participate in the competition from abroad must attach the link of the artworks/products they will upload to the download link (such as Google Drive or WeTransfer) that will be active for at least 7 (seven) days, to the Annex-1 form and send it to the e-mail address of their region.

CHAPTER THREE

EVALUATION

EVALUATION STAGES, EVALUATION CRITERIA, COMPETITION SCHEDULE, AWARDING AND AWARDS CEREMONY

EVALUATION STAGES

ARTICLE 11 - Zero Waste and Sustainability Competition; Food Waste-Themed Short Film, Advanced Recycling-Useful Model, Waste to Art Categories are as follows.

11.1. Domestic (Türkiye) Evaluation - Short Film on Food Waste, Upcycling - Useful Model, Waste to Art Categories Evaluation Stages

11.1.1. First Stage - School Evaluation Commission

11.1.1.1. Artworks/Products submitted to the competition are evaluated by the school evaluation commission at the schools.

11.1.1.2. Documents pertaining to the one (1) artwork/product selected by the school evaluation commission for each category are sent to the district national education directorates via official letter or portable memory device (the method requested by the provincial/district directorate is paramount).

11.1.2. Second Stage - District Evaluation Commission

11.1.2.1. The digital files of the posters sent to the provincial directorates of national education are evaluated by the provincial directorates of national education commission.

11.1.2.2. Documents pertaining to one (1) Artwork/Product selected from each category by the district evaluation commission are sent to provincial national education directorates via official letter or portable memory device (the method requested by the provincial directorate is paramount).

11.1.3. Third Stage - Provincial Evaluation Commission

11.1.3.1. Digital copies of the Artworks/Products sent to provincial directorates of national education are evaluated by the provincial evaluation commission.

11.1.3.2. The provincial evaluation commission requests the originals of the winning artworks/products from schools. These originals are kept in the provincial directorates of national education and sent to the Ministry of National Education upon request.

11.1.3.3. Documents pertaining to the first-place artworks/products selected by the provincial commission are sent via official correspondence through the Electronic Document Management System (EBYS) to the Directorate General of Support Services, Department of Projects and Social Partners, and to the email address sas2026ulusal@meb.gov.tr for preliminary evaluation by the MoNE.

11.1.3.4. The artworks/products selected by the national commission in the preliminary evaluation are sent to the address to be specified later by the provincial directorate of national education, following the request of the MoNE.

11.1.4. Fourth Stage - National Evaluation Commission

11.1.4.1. The MoNE determines the artworks/products selected as a result of the preliminary evaluation conducted by the national evaluation commission based on the electronic records of the artworks/products.

11.1.4.2. The MoNE requests the originals of the selected artworks/products from the provincial directorates.

11.1.4.3. Following the preliminary evaluation, the original copies of the artworks/products sent by the provincial directorates of national education to the national commission for evaluation are re-examined, and the top three artworks/products in each category are selected and forwarded to the international evaluation commission.

11.2. International Evaluation

11.2.1. First Stage - Regional Evaluation Commissions

11.2.1.1. International applications received at the email addresses of the Regional Evaluation Commissions to be established within the MoNE are evaluated by the Regional Evaluation Commission.

11.2.1.2. The evaluation results will determine the top three artworks/products selected from each category, which will be forwarded to the international evaluation commission.

11.2.2. Second Stage - International Evaluation Commission

11.2.2.1. The International Evaluation Commission evaluates the artworks/products submitted by the Regional Evaluation and National Evaluation Commissions.

11.2.2.2. It determines the artworks/products that qualify for awards.

ARTICLE 12 - The evaluation steps for the Zero Waste and Sustainability Competition's **Living School Gardens Category** are as follows.

12.1. Domestic (Türkiye) Evaluation

12.1.1. First Stage - District Evaluation Commission

12.1.1.1. Posters sent digitally to district national education directorates are evaluated by the district national education directorate commission.

12.1.1.2. Documents pertaining to one (1) artwork/product selected by the district evaluation commission for each category are sent to the provincial national education directorates via official letter or portable memory device (the method requested by the provincial directorate is paramount).

12.1.2. Second Stage - Provincial Evaluation Commission

12.1.2.1. Digital documents of posters sent to provincial directorates of national education are evaluated by the provincial directorate of national education commission.

12.1.2.2. The documents belonging to the poster ranked first by the provincial commission are sent for preliminary evaluation by the MoNE via official correspondence through the Electronic Document Management System (EBYS) (to the Projects and Social Partners Department, Directorate General of Support Services) and to the e-mail address sas2026ulusal@meb.gov.tr.

12.1.2.3. The first-place entry from each province among the evaluated applications is eligible to receive an Environmental Certificate.

12.1.2.4. Documents for the presentation evaluation in the gallery are forwarded to the international commission.

12.2. Overseas Evaluation

12.2.1. First Stage - Regional Evaluation Commission

12.2.1.1. International applications received through the e-mail addresses of the Regional Evaluation Commissions to be established within MoNE are evaluated by the commission.

12.2.1.2. Three (3) of the evaluated applications from each region are eligible to receive an Environmental Certificate.

12.2.1.3. They are forwarded to the international commission for evaluation of the right to exhibit in the gallery.

12.2.2. Second Stage - International Evaluation Commission

12.2.2.1. The international evaluation Commission evaluates applications received from the Regional Evaluation Commission and provincial evaluation Commission in order to grant gallery presentation rights.

EVALUATION CRITERIA

ARTICLE 13 - The Zero Waste and Sustainability Competition Categories Evaluation Criteria are as follows.

13.1. Food Waste Theme Short Film Category Evaluation Criteria
